New Grant Collaborations



MERGE was awarded a Rural Northern Border Region Outreach Program HRSA grant to address maternal care access in rural communities by increasing the

number of OBGYN and FM physicians providing rural maternal care after residency. Kate Hoffmann DO will co-chair a new Rural Obstetrics Education Consortium tasked with creating new rural OB training intensives. Dartmouth was awarded a grant through the ABFM Foundation on behalf of the Northern New England family medicine residencies to support expansion of the NNE Learning Network infrastructure. The goal is to engage program leaders, medical & research directors, clinical teachers, and staff in sharing and adopting improvements and innovations in GME regionally.

Integrative Shared Medical Appointments



Patients meet weekly for 5 weeks with Dr. Alyssa Finn and a registered dietician or naturopathic doctor in a group of 6-12 at the

ACH teaching kitchen to build community, set goals, practice mindfulness & movement, and cook and eat together with a focus on plant-based vegetarian meals. Referrals are being accepted for the Jan-Feb and Feb-March series. Place a consult/referral to the prevention center, specify SMA with Dr. Finn in the yellow clinical info box, and your patient will be contacted in 1-2 business days.

Acupuncture Curriculum Reboot
